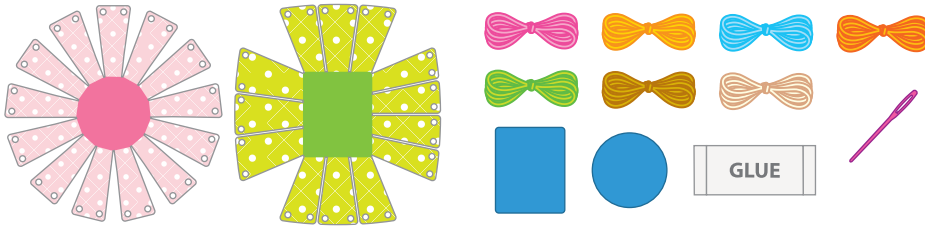

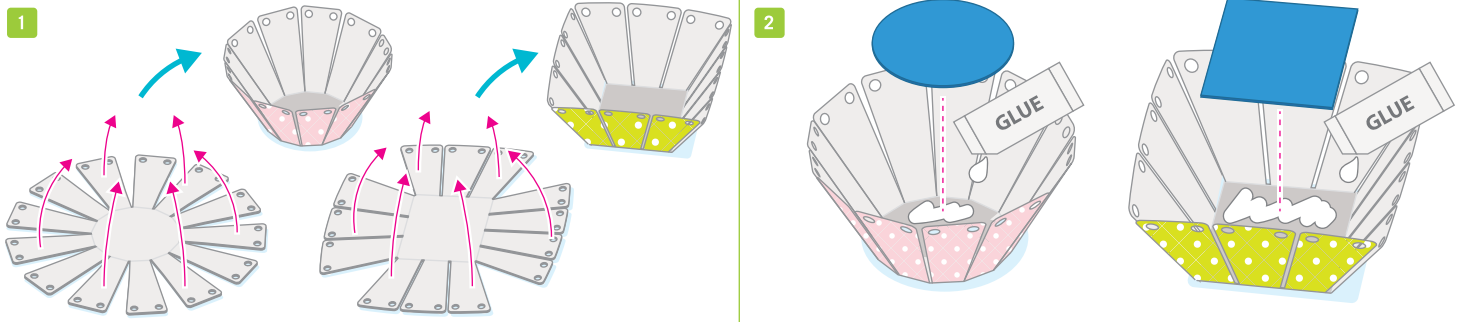


A. CONTENTS



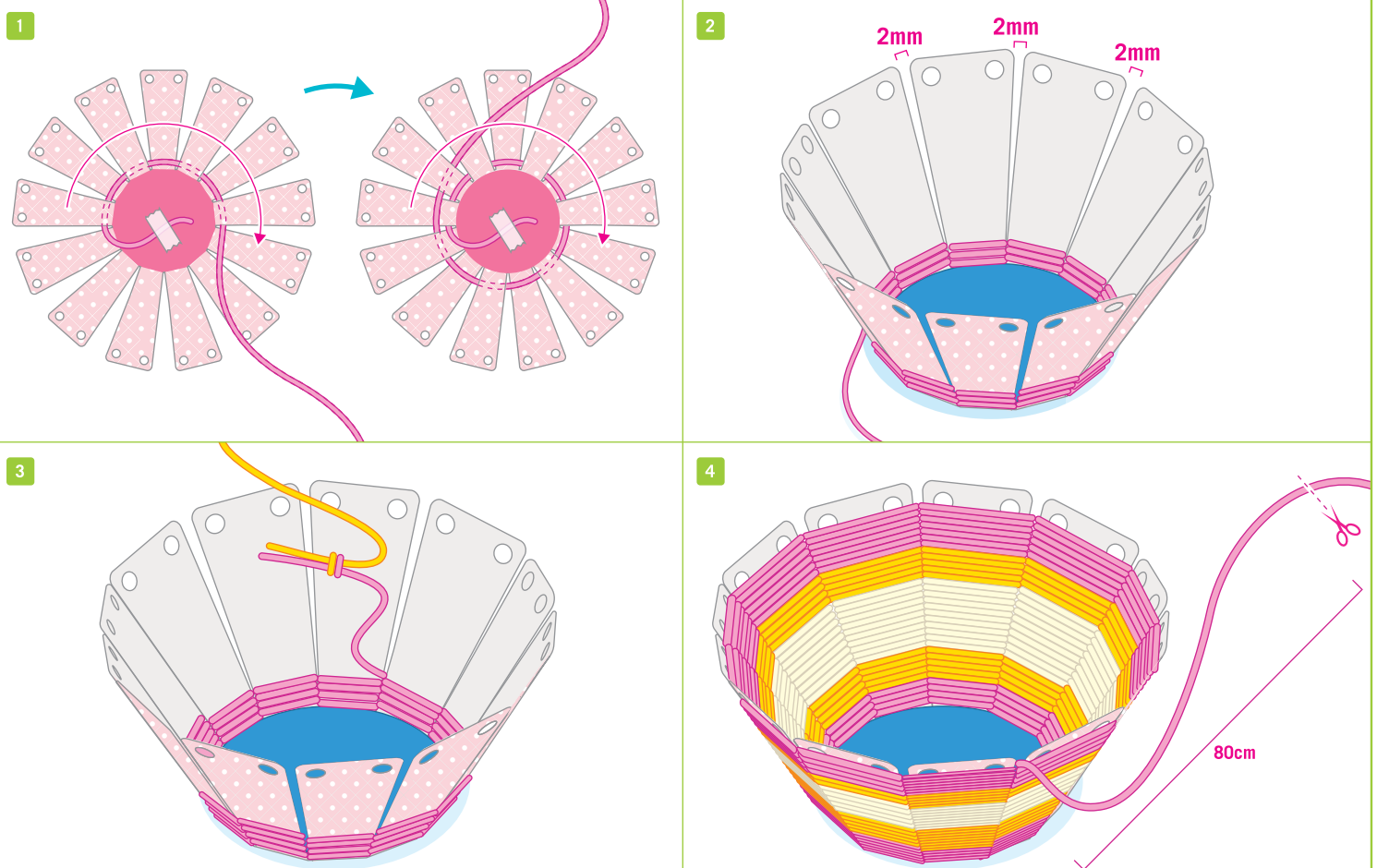
2 ready-to-use basket templates, 1 plastic needle, 2 felt cut-outs, 7 spools of coloured yarn, 1 glue pack and a set of detailed instructions.
Materials required but not included in the kit: 4 clothes pins or binder clips.

B. PREPARATION

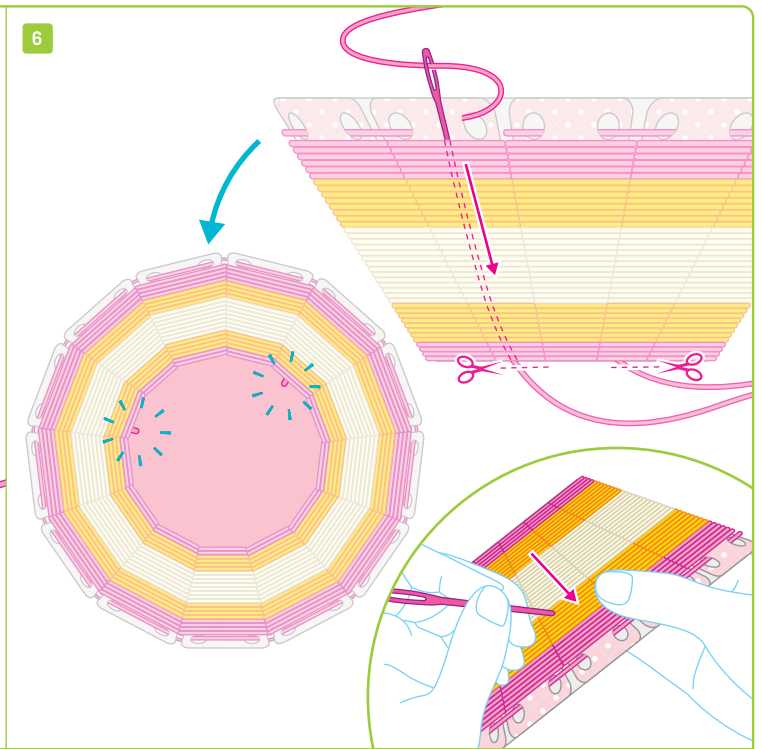
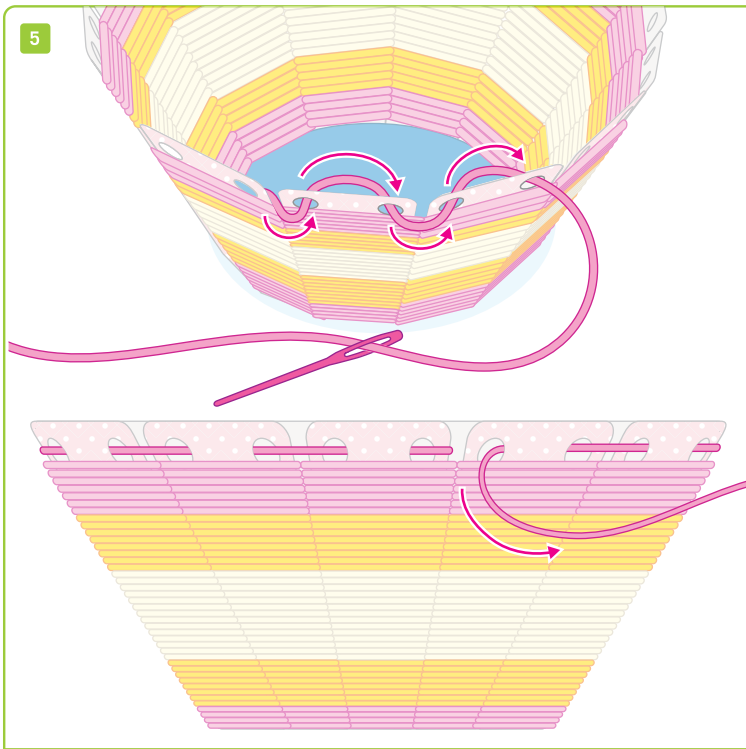


1. Fold the sides of the basket templates upwards so the flat square/ circular bottom of the basket templates are the only things touching the table.
2. Stick the felt cutouts to the flat bottoms of each basket with glue and leave it for 10 minutes. Take a moment to plan your design and choose the best combination of coloured yarn.

C. BASKET WEAVING

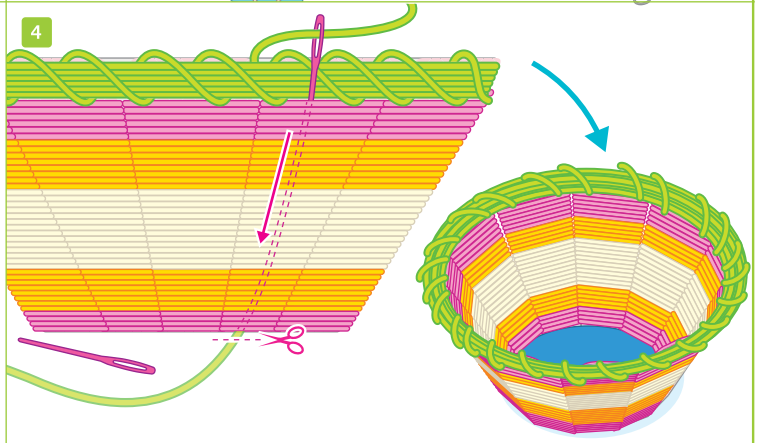
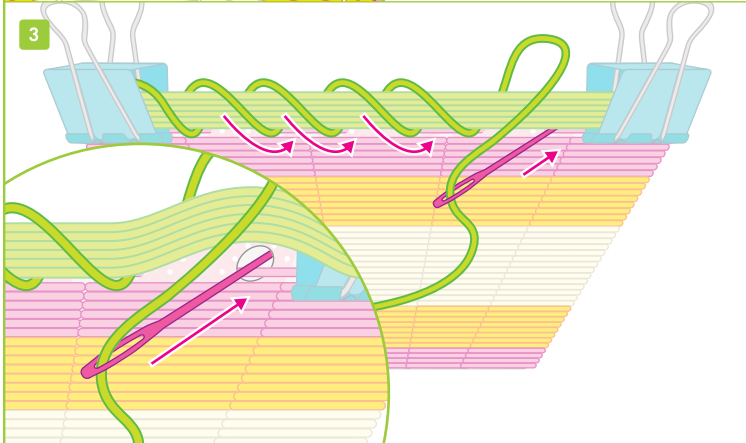
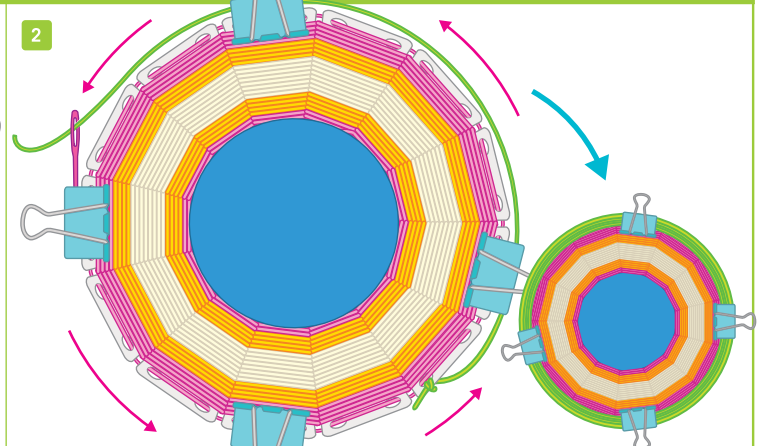
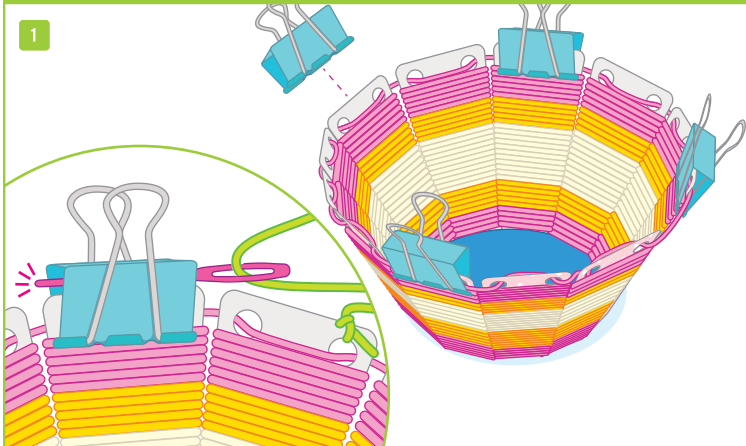


1. Choose one spool of coloured yarn and tape one end of the yarn to the base so that it stays in place as you begin to weave. Weave the yarn around in a clockwise direction, alternating between wrapping it around the outside and inside of the basket's panels.
2. Make sure the weave is not too tight, and that there is a 2mm separation in between the tops of each panel so they don't overlap.
3. Continue weaving until you want to add another colour to the basket. Change the yarn colour by tying the end you were weaving with to the new colour, making sure that the knot is inside the basket. Continue to weave the yarn in the alternating pattern illustrated above.
4. Once the yarn has reached the middle of the holes at the top of the template, leave a 80-cm long string of yarn and cut the excess.



5. Thread the yarn through the needle and begin stitching by passing the needle through each hole in alternating directions to make a complete loop. This will secure the weaves you done in steps C1-4.
6. Thread the needle in between the weave you created and the basket template, then remove the needle. Afterwards, remove the tape in step C1 and trim the excess. Finally, spread the yarn evenly with the help of the needle.

D. BASKET DECORATIONS



1. Secure the top of the basket with 4 clothes pins/binder clips as illustrated. Make sure there is enough space between the pin/clip and the top edge of the basket so that the needle is able to pass through it. Select and cut a 450cm piece of coloured yarn. Thread it through the hole and secure the end of the yarn to one of the holes, so that it stays in place as you begin to weave.
2. Pass the needle through the space in between the clips and the basket's rim as illustrated to make several loops.
3. Stop when you have about 120cm of your yarn left. Then, start to wind and thread the yarn through the holes to secure the loops you have made in step D2. Afterwards, carefully release the clips one by one.
4. When you have wound the yarn completely around the rim once, pass the needle in between the weave and basket template as illustrated, remove the needle and cut the excess. Spread the loops evenly around the rim. Your basket is now complete!
